In addition to resident tropical birds, Caribbean islands receive winter migrant birds from North America, Europe and the Arctic regions plus South American migrant birds from the austral winter. Areas of interest in Trinidad include Yerette's, Caroni Bird Sanctuary, Nariva Swamp, Asa Wright Nature Centre, Pointe-a-Pierre Wild Fowl Trust, Blanchisseuse Road, and Grande Riviere.

Global Bird Fair was a stage to promote Destination Trinidad as a desired spot within the specialized niche market of Birding. Our participation at this event served not only to introduce the destination but also a springboard to targeted readership/membership with Birding magazines and associations as well as build relationships.
